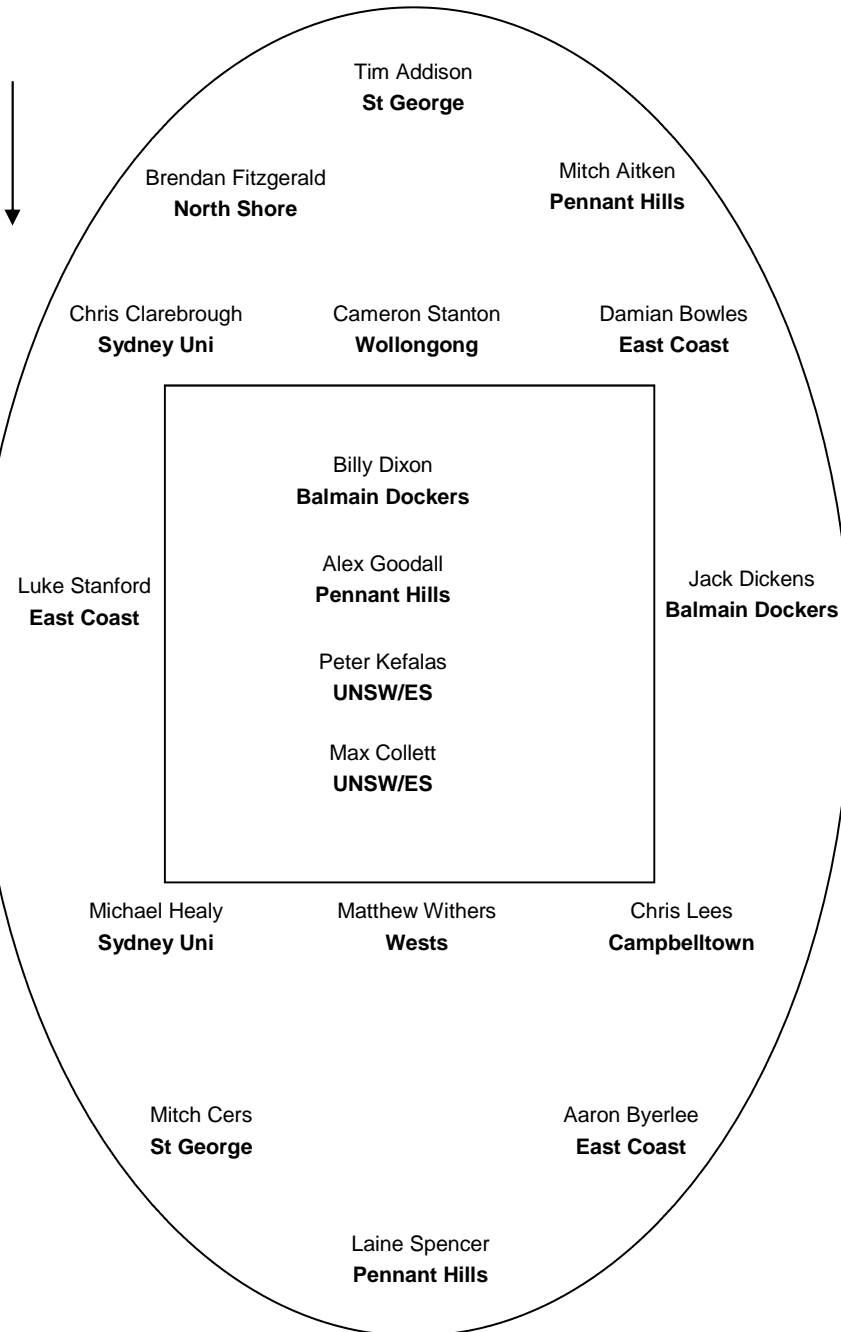

Where a player elects to dive on the ball or, when on the ground, elects to drag the ball underneath his or her body and is correctly tackled, the player is to be penalized for holding the ball if he or she fails to immediately knock the ball clear or correctly dispose of it.

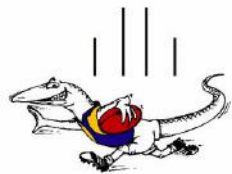
