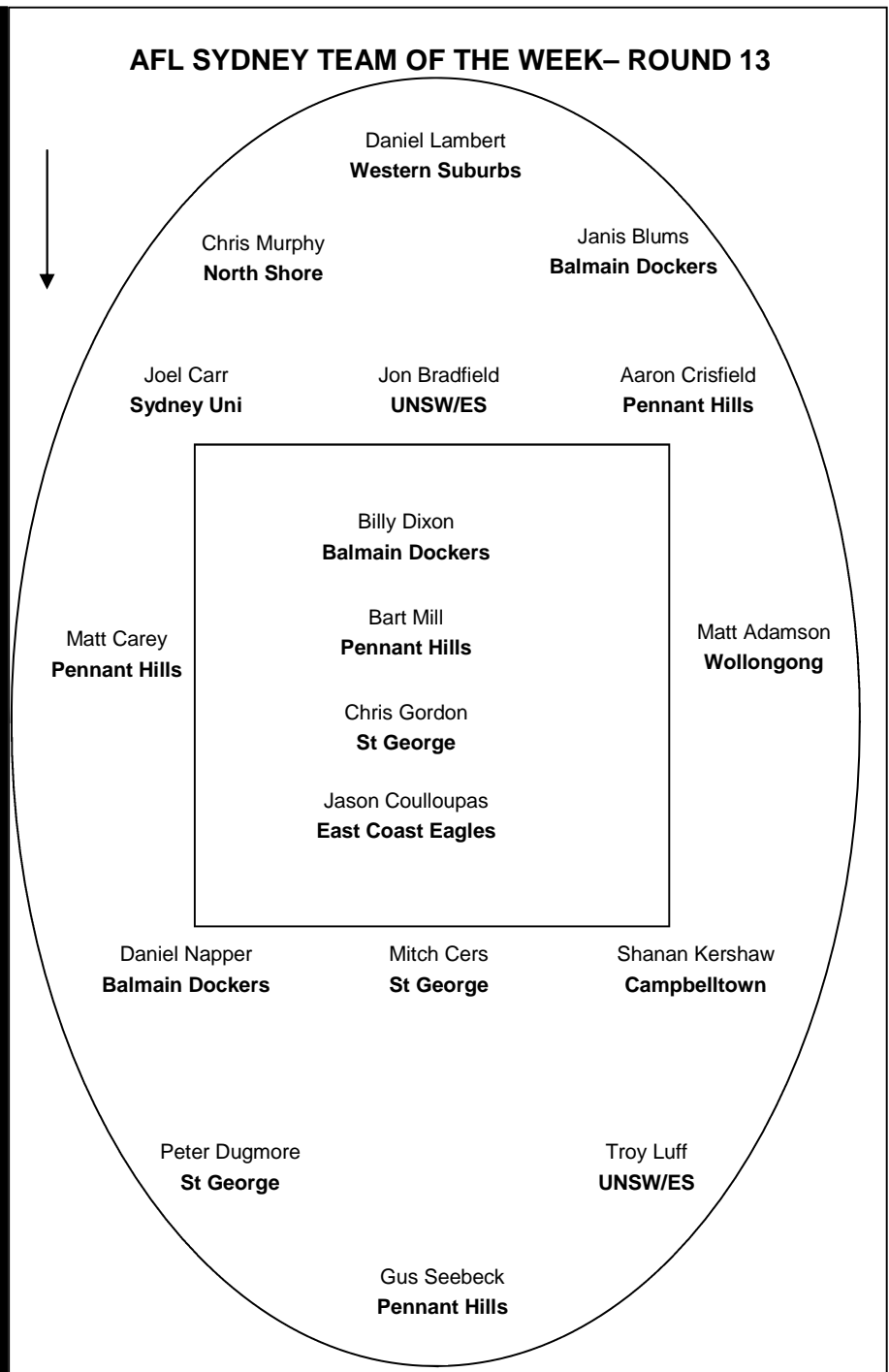

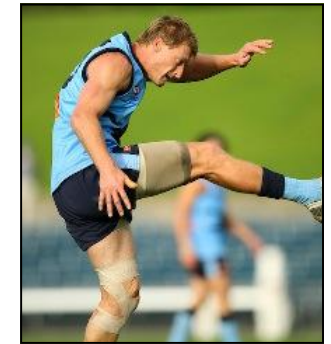

### Goal Umpiring

If a goal umpire is appointed by the Sydney AFL then they are the final judge of a score. They are also responsible for recording all behinds and goals scored in a match.



To be registered as a score, the ball must have completely crossed the goal or behind line or hit the goal post. For a goal to be recorded the ball must cross the goal line after being kicked by the attacking team. For a behind to be recorded the ball must cross the behind line, be touched by a player before completely crossing the goal or behind line, or hit the goal post. If the ball hits or travels over the top of the behind post, it will be considered out of bounds.

When a score is recorded the goal umpire waives one flag for a behind and two flags for a goal so that both goal umpires will record a correct score.

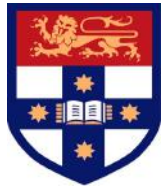
St George are hosting the Adelaide Football Club next week and one of the many events surrounding the day is a Sportsman's Lunch at The St George Masos.

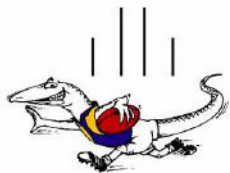
