



If a goal umpire is appointed by the Sydney AFL then they are the final judge of a score. They are also responsible for recording all behinds and goals scored in a match.





team. For a behind to be recorded the ball must cross the behind line, be touched by a player before completely crossing the goal or behind line, or hit the goal post. If the ball hits or travels over the top of the behind post, it will be considered out of bounds.

When a score is recorded the goal umpire waives one flag for a behind and two flags for a goal so that both goal umpires will record a correct score.

The week of development involved coaching sessions run by the AFL Umpiring Department, fitness & strengthening sessions (including the character building recovery session at Brighton Beach and post match ice baths), a "Dealing With Pressure" presentation from the AFL Umpires Psychologist, the utilisation of "Matchcomm" during the Round 4 matches and the live broadcast on Fox Sports of the Round 5 matches.

In addition, we were coached by current and former AFL Umpires (Bryan Sheehan, Darren Goldspink, Matt Stevic, Stephen McBurney and Hayden Kennedy). Tapping into the knowledge-bank of these Umpires was priceless in terms of further developing our professional on and off field performances.


