Three Rounds to go and East Coast Eagles are facing an uphill battle to make the top four. Who would have thought this after Round 5???? Have St George got the wobbles and can anyone stop Pennant Hills? These questions and more will be answered in Round 16 of the 2007 FOXTEL Sydney AFL.



East Coast Eagles and St George do battle at the Sydney Showgrounds in a match which holds significant importance for both teams. This match will also feature on Foxtel Channel 183 on Wednesday 8.30pm and again on Saturday at 8.00am. Following the defeat last week against North Shore the Eagles have no more second chances. On paper they had their best team of the year on the ground which made the performance even more disappointing. Ladder leaders St George are also in a bit of a form slump and only fell over the line against Balmain Dockers last week. Coach Tognolini has a number of players carrying injury and he will need them back on the field and in good form if they are going to challenge at season end. The Dockers know that time is running out for that all important first win this year and they will be going all out against the Bombers. North Shore are a pacy outfit and with Davies, Hill, Fitzgerald, Pryor and Attwood all up and running should have the ammunition to stop the Dockers. **North Shore by 55 points**

UNSW/ES returned to the winners list last week and will be looking to make it two in a row against Wollongong at Village Green. A month ago the Bulldogs were well in the running for a finals berth however a couple of poor performances put paid to this, and now they are focussed on finishing the season on a good note. The Lions on the otherhand have had a frustrating season with injuries and will need a rejuvenated performance if they are to return to the "gong" with the points. **UNSW/ES by 36 points.**

Henson Park is the venue for the final game of the week between Sydney Uni and Western Suburbs. Both sides will be playing for pride and possibly seventh position on the ladder. The Students felt the full force of the Demons last week whilst the Magpies were overrun by the Bulldogs. This will be the closest match of the round with **West's to win by 10 points.**

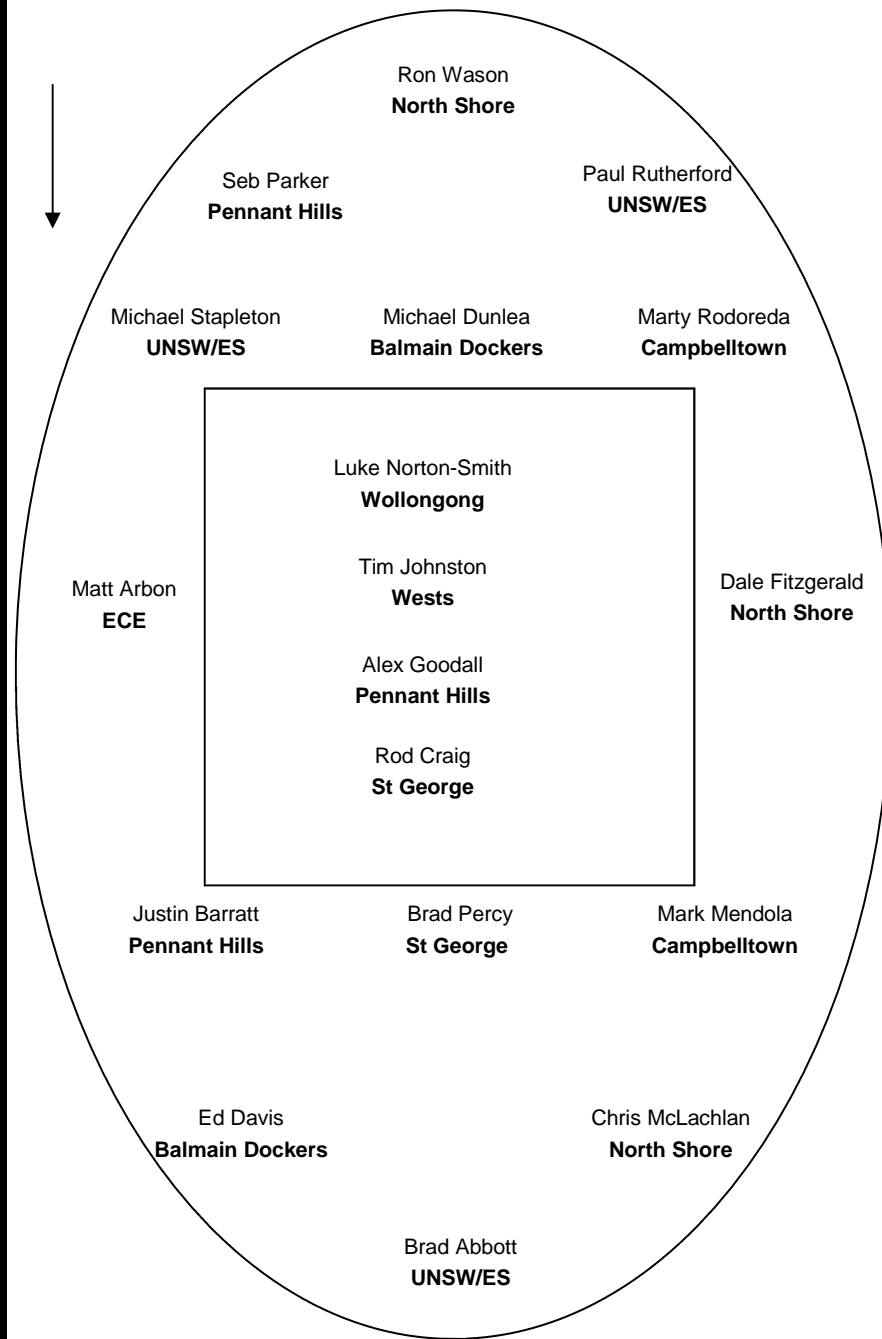

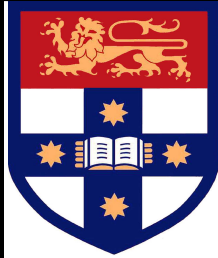
