FROM BEHIND THE DESK

Lets have a look at the wash out for all competitions with the final round being played this weekend.

Premier Division

East Coast Eagles have won the Minor Premiership and will have the first week of the finals off. Western Suburbs are guaranteed a spot in the Qualifying final. UNSW/ES need to defeat Sydney University to gain the other qualifying final spot. Should they lose, the door will open for Pennant Hills to sneak into third place should they defeat Western Suburbs. Campbelltown will play either UNSW/ES or Pennant Hills in the Elimination Final.

Division One

UTS only need to defeat North Shore today to go through the home and away season undefeated, which is a fantastic achievement. Manly Warringah and East Coast Eagles will play in the Qualifying Final. UNSW/ES and Sydney University will use today as a preview to their Elimination Final clash next week.

Division Two

Southern Power have won the Minor Premiership and will also complete an unbeaten home and away season if they defeat Campbelltown today. They will play Macquarie University in the second semi final, with the Warriors only two losses this year being at the hands of the Power. UTS and Holroyd Parramatta will meet in the 1st Semi Final.

Division Three

UNSW/ES and Nor West will battle for the Minor Premiership today. UNSW/ES play fellow finalist UTS whilst Nor West take on the winless Holroyd Parramatta. If both teams win, Nor West will need to have an 86 point better winning margin than to take the title. In any case both teams will meet in the second semi final whilst UTS and Macquarie University are expected to meet in the first semi final. Moorebank Sports are still a mathematical chance however need to defeat Macquarie University by approx 163 points to take fourth position.

Division Four

Sydney University have won the Minor Premiership. If UNSW/ES can defeat Penrith they will finish second however if they lose and Nor West defeat Holroyd Parramatta the Jets will finish second. Fourth place will also be decided today, with UTS currently holding onto fourth position taking on Sydney University and Manly Warringah taking on winless Camden. If UTS win they will hold onto fourth spot if they lose and Manly Warringah win, the Wolves will compete in this years finals at the expense of the Bats.

Sydney University have claimed the Minor Premiership and will play the winner of today's clash between Southern Power and Penrith. Moorebank Sports are expected to claim fourth position, although Pennant Hills are a mathematical chance, however would need to defeat Sydney University and rely on Moorebank Sports losing to Macquarie University, and also bridge the 155 point difference in the for and against.

Today will be last time we see Balmain Dockers, Camden and St Ignatius College, Riverview for 2009 and we would like to thank them for the contribution they have made to the competitions in 2009.

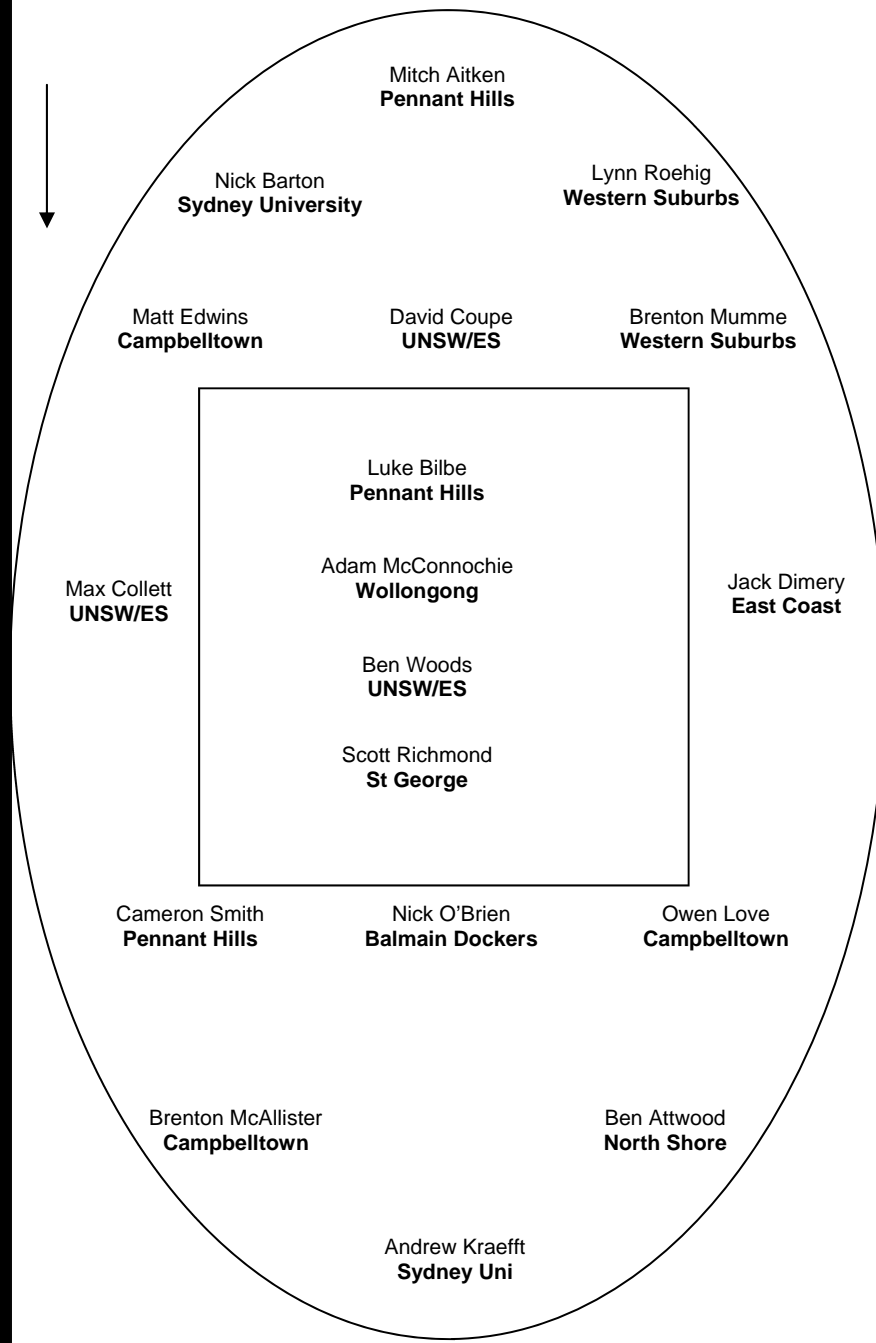

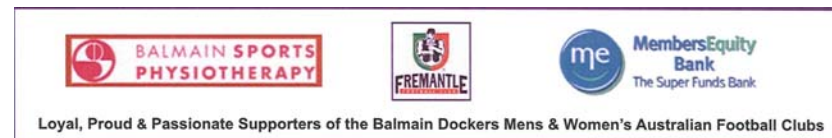

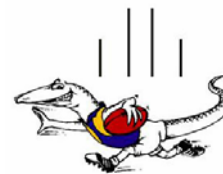
