

Peter joined the Hawkesbury Junior Australian Rules Football Club (HJARFC) back in 1985 along with wife Jenny and their two sons, Damien and Dominic. His involvement with the club started like many others since, cooking on the barbecue. Peter has always been passionate and active around the club. Not long after joining the club Peter took on the role of secretary for the club, a position he held for many years. 


Seniors started off well setting a good lead in the 1st quarter, but a determined Goannas side took control of the match in the 2nd quarter and set up a strong victory from there on forward.
