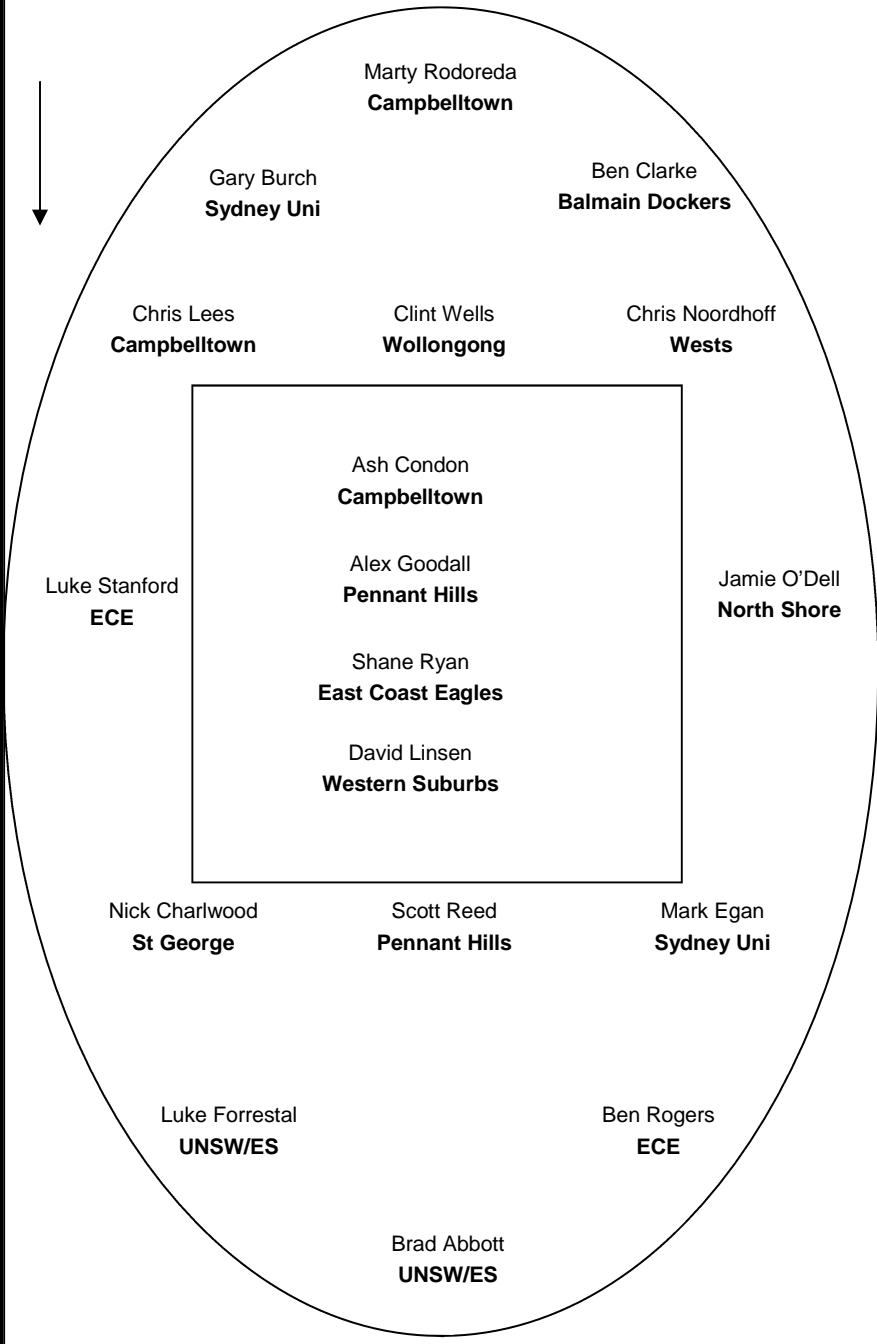

THE SYDNEY Swans' big win over West Coast has been further sweetened with young midfielder Kieren Jack's NAB AFL Rising Star nomination for round four.

Jack also racked up 14 disposals and kicked a goal in the Swans' 62-point win.

The former rookie and NSW/ACT Ram is the first Swan to be nominated for the award since Paul Bevan in round four, 2004.

Jack is a product of the Pennant Hills junior and senior clubs as well as the AFL (NSW/ACT) talent program. He is one of thirteen (13) former Sydney AFL players on AFL lists in 2008

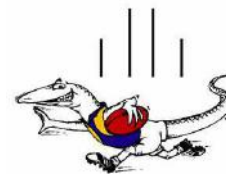
