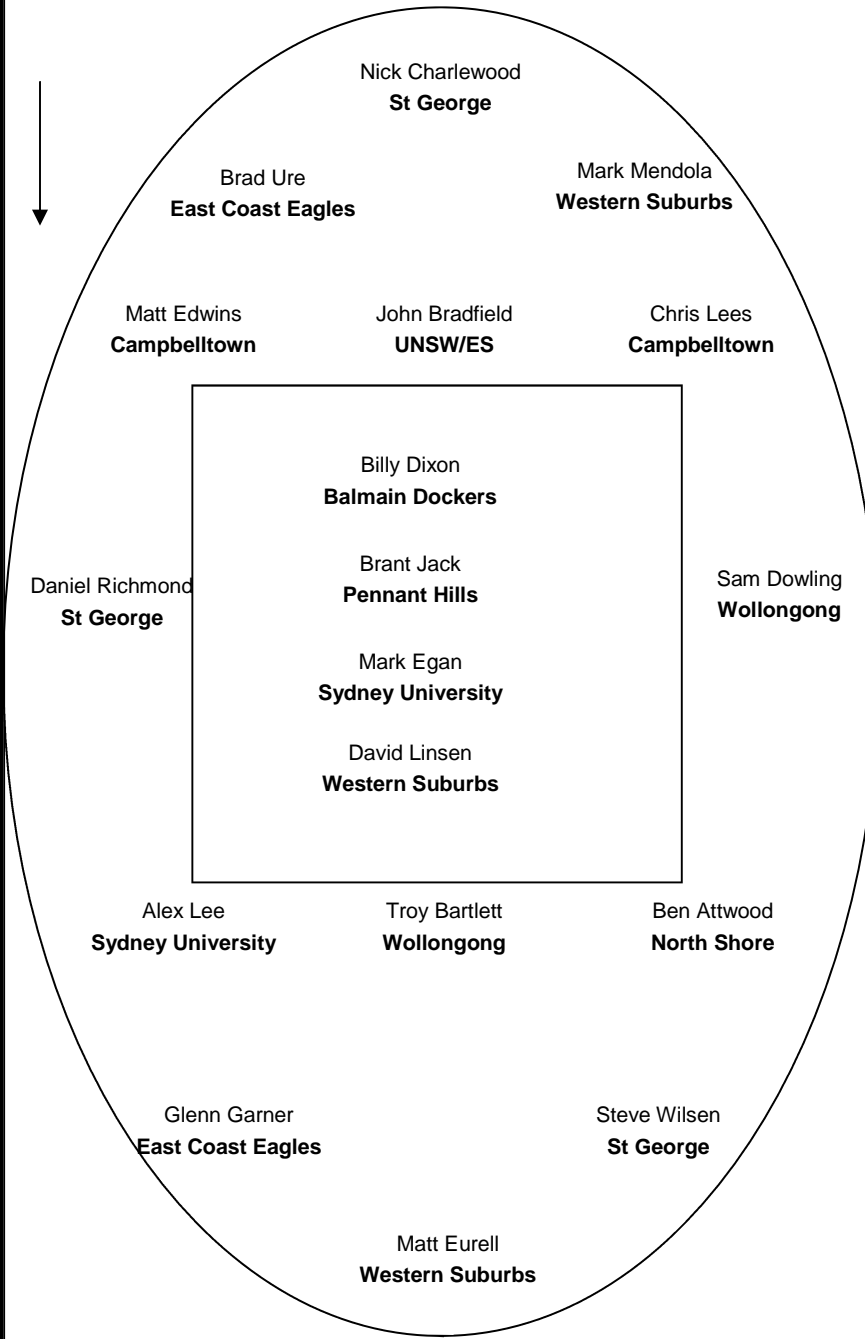

2008 will see a busy Representative year for the Sydney AFL with three matches scheduled. The Sydney AFL Under 23's side will travel to Newcastle to take on the Black Diamond AFL on May 17.

On the June long weekend, a Representative side comprising of players from the First & Second Division clubs will be competing in the NSW Regional Championships at Wagga Wagga. These championships will include 12 leagues from throughout NSW and ACT.

The main fixture of the year will be the clash between Sydney AFL and the strong Victorian Amateurs (VAFA) at Henson Park on Sunday, June 8.

Well known Sydney AFL identity Danny Ryan will be coach of the Senior and Under 23 Representative sides whilst Peter Free will be in charge of the 1st Division side. Both these men have excellent qualifications and have put together a good support team. They will be out and about at games surveying the talent available and will be selecting training squads in the coming weeks.

2008 will also see the staging of the Australian Country Championships at Shepparton from 24-27 July. Up to six (6) players of Country Origin from Sydney AFL are eligible for selection in the NSW side to participate in this prestigious competition.

Representative Football is an important part of football as it gives the players the opportunity to display their skills at the next level.

AFL clubs are continuing to scour the Sydney Region looking for talented youngster whom they can place on scholarship. Currently 32 players are on AFL Scholarships including 24 from Sydney AFL Clubs.

Under the terms of the NSW/ACT Scholarship Program, Each AFL Club may contract up to a maximum of two (2) Scholarship Players per year and may maintain a Scholarship List up to a maximum of six (6) players at any one time. Once a Scholarship Player meets the necessary age requirement, a club may apply to the AFL to transfer a player from its Scholarship List onto its Primary List prior to the annual AFL Draft. Sydney Swans transferred Craig Bird from the Scholarship List to its Primary List prior to the 2007 Draft.

A player is eligible to be included on the Scholarship List of a club provided:

- He has lived in a NSW Development Region, or has been a student at a school in NSW or ACT for at least the previous three (3) continuous years,
- Is aged between fifteen (15) and seventeen (17) years prior to 31 December in the year he is first included on the list.

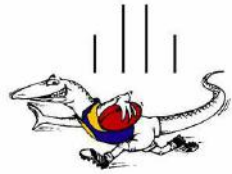
