




BRYDON COLES (Sydney University)

Marking Contests

"The player whose sole objective is to contest a mark shall be permitted to do so."

Where there is incidental contact in a marking contest when the ball is the sole objective (eyes on the ball), play on will result.

When a player leaps early, the attempt must be realistic (i.e. he/she must be able to touch the ball).

The passing of Bill early this year brought much sadness to us all but his memory lives on in the Club everyday. Many wondeful people have contributed to our organization over the years and as we celebrate today we should all recognise that as the custodians of a great Club with a proud tradition must cherish what we have and make sure that we leave a fantastic legacy for those who will follow. 
