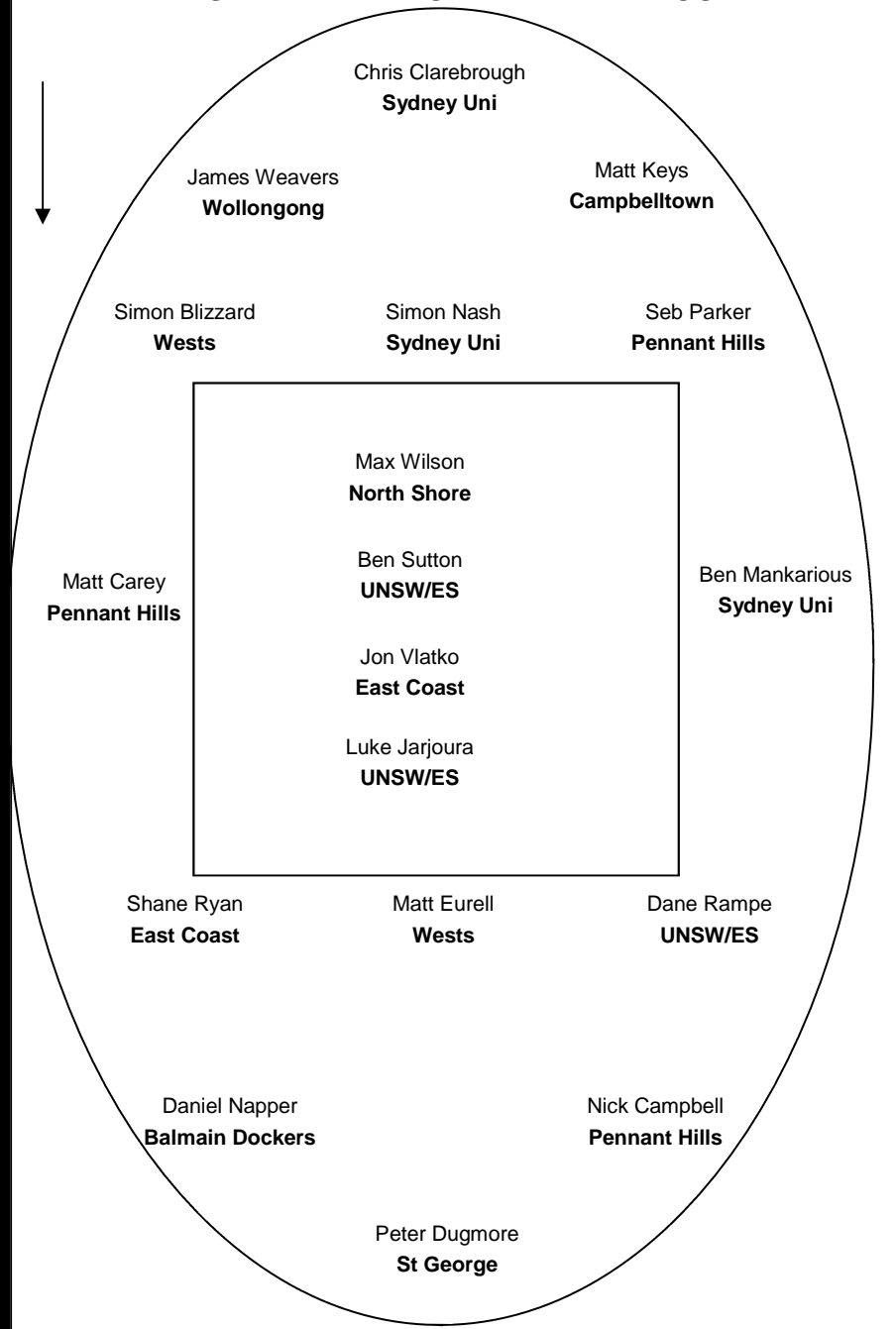

The passing of Bill early this year brought much sadness to us all but his memory lives on in the Club everyday. Many wonderful people have contributed to our organization over the years and as we celebrate today we should all recognise that as the custodians of a great Club with a proud tradition must cherish what we have and make sure that we leave a fantastic legacy for those who will follow. 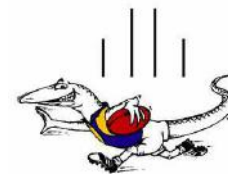
