Following today's newspaper reports the AFL would like to reassure the football community of the following; The AFL Commission has again reiterated its support for the establishment of the 18th team in Western Sydney in 2012.



On Monday April 27, the Commission made it clear that it understands the challenges ahead and is committed to the 2012 target date.

A team in Western Sydney will provide new jobs and economic activity in the region as well as providing significant community activity and opportunities for Western Sydney families.

To date the AFL has already invested significantly in the development of the code to build community infrastructure and community and sporting opportunities for the families of Greater Western Sydney and we will continue to do so as we move towards establishing a team in greater Western Sydney.

The process in establishing that team will unfold over the coming months with one of the key tasks being the establishment of a local Greater Western Sydney advisory committee. We currently have more than 35 local business, community and sporting identities who are keen to see the establishment of a new national sporting team in the region.

There are a number of stadium options being discussed and we will continue to discuss them with a range of stakeholders, including government.

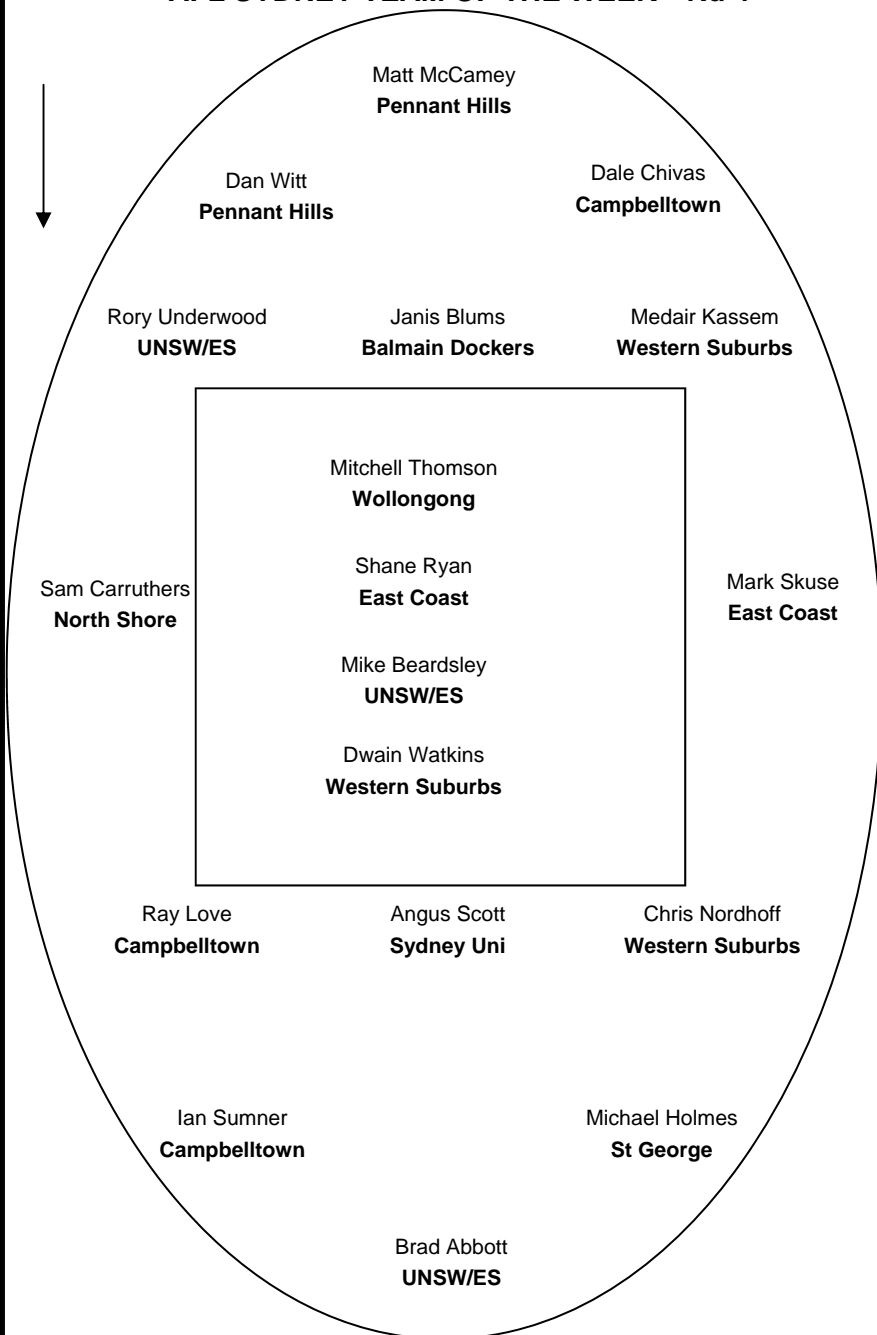

SHANE MCSPEERIN—300 GAMES

Congratulations to **Shane McSpeerin** who this week officiates in his 300th game. Shane has been involved in umpiring for over 17 years and during that time he has rarely missed a game. He is also a life member of the NSW Australian Football Umpires Association. Shane is well known to all of the first grade clubs in Sydney AFL as well as many officials and players. Players and officials have welcomed his friendly and approachable manner and this has done much to promote closer relationships between clubs and umpires. He is an astute student of the game and his insights into the game are well respected. The line "I have a theory" usually precedes some of his best insights. He has also been known to offer "assistance" to field umpires who may be debating the best and fairest votes at the end of a game. Shane possesses an uncanny recall of sporting statistics and his coverage extends to numerous sports.



Shane has a prominent sporting background. He played football for the Melbourne Football Club (the Demons) from 1971 to 1973 and made 16 first grade appearances kicking a total of 11 goals. For those with a keen interest in sports history, Shane worn jumper number 50 in 1971-2 and jumper number 20 in 1973. In his playing days his registered playing height was 185cm and weight of 78kg. He would have played many more first grade games if not for persistent hamstring injuries. He played across the half forward line and was a strong mark and possessed great speed, which came from excellent athletic ability. He was also a very competitive 800m runner in his school days and he has one of the fastest times for the Demons around the famous "Tan Track" in a pre season run. His football career continued after Melbourne with VFA club Prahran and in later years in the Amateurs. Shane was also a talented cricketer and played A Grade Turf in a Melbourne suburban competition. Of more recent years Shane has battled leg injuries and he could probably write a thesis on the workings of hamstring and adductors muscles. Despite this he still manages to get the task completed each week and many of the younger boundary umpires still wonder how he manages to get to the goal posts before they do. The hours on the massage table at training have clearly proved invaluable. Shane is in the twilight of his career but he still performs admirably at first grade level. Congratulations, from all your umpiring friends on a wonderful achievement and best wishes for a successful season in 2009 and more in the future.

Shane has been involved in umpiring for over 17 years and during that time he has rarely missed a game. He is also a life member of the NSW Australian Football Umpires Association. Shane is well known to all of the first grade clubs in Sydney AFL as well as many officials and players. Players and officials have welcomed his friendly and approachable manner and this has done much to promote closer relationships between clubs and umpires. He is an astute student of the game and his insights into the game are well respected. The line "I have a theory" usually precedes some of his best insights. He has also been known to offer "assistance" to field umpires who may be debating the best and fairest votes at the end of a game. Shane possesses an uncanny recall of sporting statistics and his coverage extends to numerous sports. Shane has a prominent sporting background. He played football for the Melbourne Football Club (the Demons) from 1971 to 1973 and made 16 first grade appearances kicking a total of 11 goals. For those with a keen interest in sports history, Shane worn jumper number 50 in 1971-2 and jumper number 20 in 1973. In his playing days his registered playing height was 185cm and weight of 78kg. He would have played many more first grade games if not for persistent hamstring injuries. He played across the half forward line and was a strong mark and possessed great speed, which came from excellent athletic ability. He was also a very competitive 800m runner in his school days and he has one of the fastest times for the Demons around the famous "Tan Track" in a pre season run. His football career continued after Melbourne with VFA club Prahran and in later years in the Amateurs. Shane was also a talented cricketer and played A Grade Turf in a Melbourne suburban competition. Of more recent years Shane has battled leg injuries and he could probably write a thesis on the workings of hamstring and adductors muscles. Despite this he still manages to get the task completed each week and many of the younger boundary umpires still wonder how he manages to get to the goal posts before they do. The hours on the message table at training have clearly proved invaluable. Shane is in the twilight of his career but he still performs admirably at first grade level. Congratulations, from all your umpiring friends on a wonderful achievement and best wishes for a successful season in 2009 and more in the future.

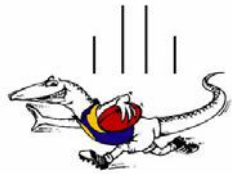
