

#### **RAMS hold Cannons' fire**

The NSW/ACT RAMS have continued their outstanding lead-up to this year's Under-18 National Championships by downing the form team of the TAC Cup competition. In their first of three TAC Cup clashes for the year, the RAMS came from behind to beat the Calder Cannons by eight points in Melbourne on Saturday, winning 11.12 (78) to 10.11 (71).

The RAMS' victory, which came on the back of a convincing 51-point drubbing of Tasmania last month, sounds a warning to their division two rivals ahead of the national titles in late June.

Key forward Taylor Walker booted six goals to spearhead the visitors' win as the RAMS fought back from a 13-point deficit at the long break to inflict the Cannons' first loss of the season.

Captain Craig Bird booted three goals while fellow midfielder Ranga Ediriwickrama was also superb.

RAMS coach Danny Stevens said his side would take plenty out of the win.

"The more games that we win leading up to the nationals the better, but having said that it's pointless unless we can perform at that level come the national championships," Stevens said.

"Calder had been going out and blowing teams away early in their games, and we played good, tight footy and didn't let them get away early on."

Stevens said the RAMS' win would make some footy pundits sit up and take note, given the Cannons went into the clash with a 4-0 record.

"It's the boilover of the year, I guess. It was a big effort," he said.

"It's probably got people starting to talk a bit ... a few eyes would've opened up."

NSW/ACT's win was all the more commendable given some players were forced to endure a long car trip to Melbourne the day before the game.

"That's just part and parcel of NSW footy, really," Stevens said.

"It's all about the way the kids conduct and prepare themselves."

The RAMS' clash was one-half of a double-header at Coburg City Oval on Saturday. In the other match, Queensland – another division two contender at this year's Under-18 National Championships – beat the Eastern Ranges by 15 points.

The NSW/ACT RAMS play their next TAC Cup against the Murray Bushrangers at Lavington on May 20.

#### History of the NSWAFUA

The initial NSWAFL senior grade grand final was umpired by G. Hallett in 1903. This was followed by Rev Hicks the following year, who was to start a long alliance between the Clergy and umpiring in Sydney. During the late 1960's and early 1970's the Association had both a Baptist Minister and a Catholic Priest umpiring at the same time! Since then there have been a number of clergy of different denominations officiate with the Association. Over the past seventy five years, the Association has also been involved in the social scene. During the 1970's the Umpires Ball was a highlight of the local football calendar, with plenty of participation from local clubs. It was at this time that the Association decided it should endeavour to obtain premises and become a licensed club. To this end, steps were taken to incorporate the Association as a company, which finally occurred on March 16. 1976. This made the Association the first incorporated Umpires Association in Australia. However, by this time much had changed in both the real estate and club scene in Sydney, and the original plans for a club were put aside. On March 4, 1991 the Association changed its structure to become an incorporated body under the Associations Incorporation Act of NSW. The NSWAFUA has held meetings in many locations over the years. These have included sports clubs, ex-service clubs, town halls, hotel rooms, League rooms and at football ovals. Training was not officially organised until 1965, and has since been conducted in many areas around Sydney - from open parkland and university grounds, to athletics clubs and football ovals. Venues have included Erskenville Oval, Fraser Park, Moore Park, Picken Oval, E. S. Marks Field, Alexandria Park, Rotary Field, Trumper Park, Chatswood Oval and Wyatt Park. In 1994, after many years as 'gypsies', the Association finally found a home for both training and meetings at Reg Bartley Oval, Rushcutters Bay. This permanent base has contributed to the strength and long term sustainability of the Association.

#### Centenary club milestones

The NSWAFUA currently has a number of running Members who have umpired in excess of 100 senior grade games in Sydney. Ken Ray (Goal) is nearing his 350th senior game; Frank Kalayzich (Field) should also reach 350 senior games this year; and Shane McSpeerin will reach the most senior games umpired by a Boundary Umpire (268) in the next few rounds. Joining the centenary club is Peter Nilson. (Goal), who umpired his 100th senior game in Round 4. A couple of other Goal Umpires - Con Tsonis and Sergio Villagra - will also be umpiring their 100th senior games in weeks to come.
