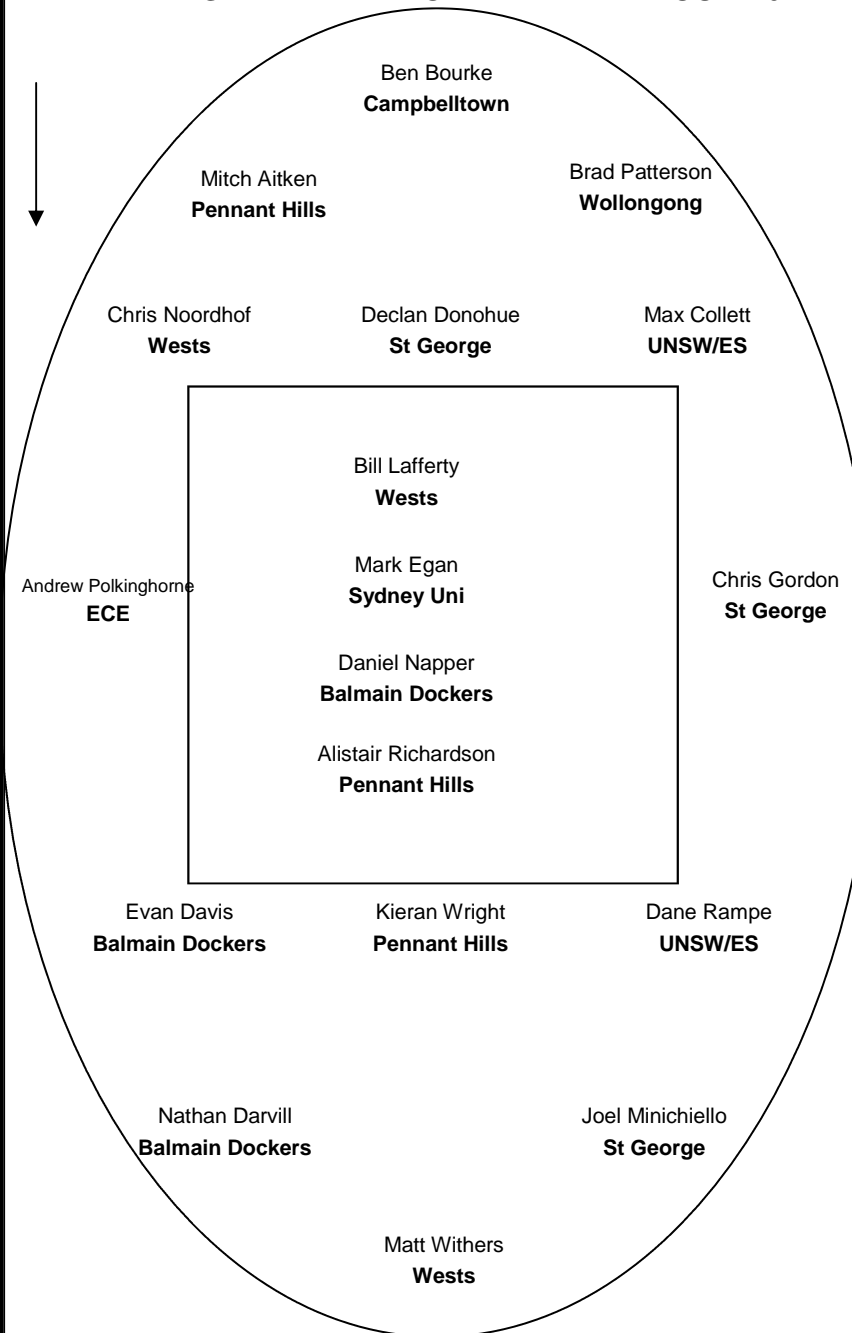

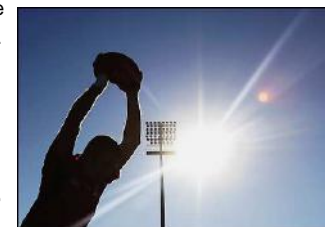

A severely undermanned Reserve Grade side were no match for their opponents, going down by 210 points, although all players who continue to front up week after week can hold their heads high.

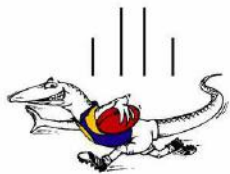
