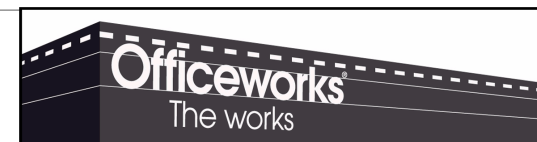

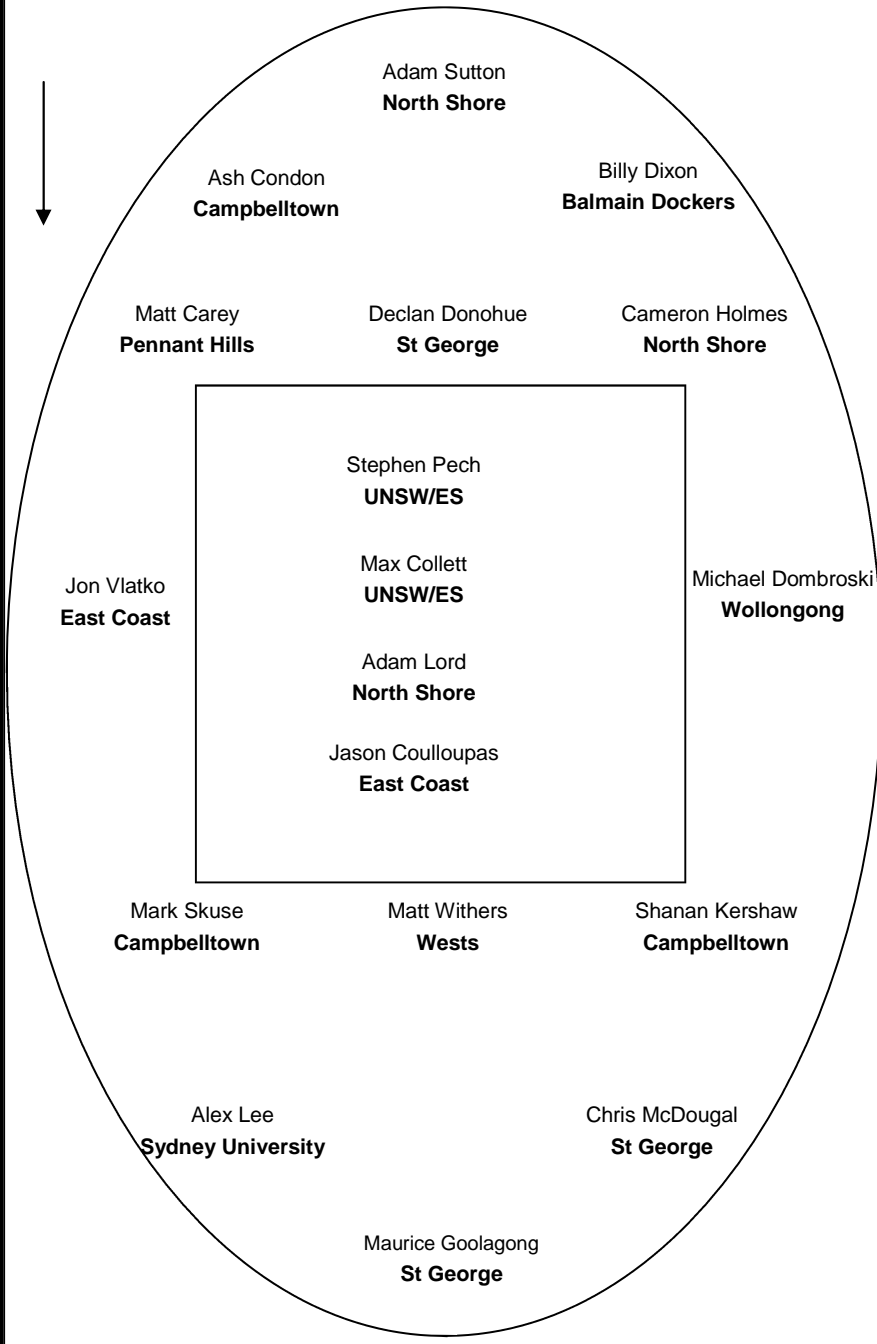

BEHIND THE WHISTLE

In an effort to achieve consistency in decision-making, there is an emphasis on understanding the "spirit of the laws" (i.e. the philosophies underlying the laws) and officiating according to the seven spirit of the laws.

50-METRE PENALTY

"After a mark or free kick has been awarded, a 50-metre penalty will be awarded against the opposing team which unduly delays the play or abuses an umpire."

An unduly delay of the play includes:

- Going over the mark before the umpire calls play on;
- Not returning the ball directly to a player after he or she has been awarded a mark or free kick;
- Unduly holding up an opponent after that player has marked the ball;
- A player not involved in a marking contest holds a player who has marked the ball or has been awarded a free kick.

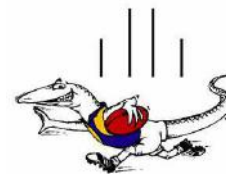

The funeral for Mary Coles, mother of Adam Coles (Hopper) and Matthew Coles and wife of John Coles, was held last Friday 6th June. Mary Coles first began her support for the Balmain Football Club in 1962 to watch husband John (former player, President, and Hall of Fame recipient) play over 300 games for the club. Two years later Mary joined the social committee and one year later in 1965 was a member of the football committee. Later on she was employed as a general assistant and helped to organise social functions for the club. For her outstanding service to this great club Mary is recognised as a life member. Mary has been a passionate supporter of Balmain for over 45 years and has enjoyed seeing her two sons (Matty & Hopper) win Premierships for the club. Her brother (Tom Watts) was a star rover in the 70's & 80's. Her brother in law Graham played briefly. Two of her nephews, Darren Hudson and David Hutchins, played in the 1997 Premiership with her youngest son Hopper, and her other brother in law Ray Hudson also played for the club. Sometimes it is easy to overlook or understate the value people like Mary or others such as Fiona Arndell who have worked so tirelessly in the background with little recognition provide to ensure the success of the club. However Mary and Fiona alike have played an integral role giving footballers a chance to represent the club at the highest level in Sydney. Without ever actually having the chance to participate in a game, the selfless nature of the support highlights the way in which Mary lived in all aspects of her life, especially with her family. Mary was a caring and loyal person and was the unofficial mother to many throughout the years at Balmain, always giving support to those in need and stern verbal advice to those who dared to do wrong by her collective bunch of boys... and of course umpires! She had a soft spot for the loveable rogues of the past such as Neil Briscoe, Chris Parker, and Freddy Hummell, but wasn't afraid to give them a piece of advice either... For example giving Chris Parker some motherly advice after beating Manly in grand Final. She told Chris that what he did was naughty after he put a solid hit on a Manly player. She probably had more courage then most to confront Chris this way, but he took it like a surrogate son would and respectfully said "yes m'am" while wearing his new premiership medallion. . . but then she probably followed up with a hug! Mary was also invaluable in helping to develop the Glebe Junior Football Club with her husband John and of course Simon Kelly and John Muggidge, who started the club. Mary was first on the committee at Glebe in 1982, but assisted as a volunteer for the inaugural season for the Greyhounds and for the next 13 years. Both Mary and John would drive from Parramatta to Glebe, and all around the inner west to help kids from broken homes to and from games. Balmain will forever be a better club because of Mary Coles.
