They know that they can't afford to lose this match if they are to have the opportunity to defend their title at the end of the year.

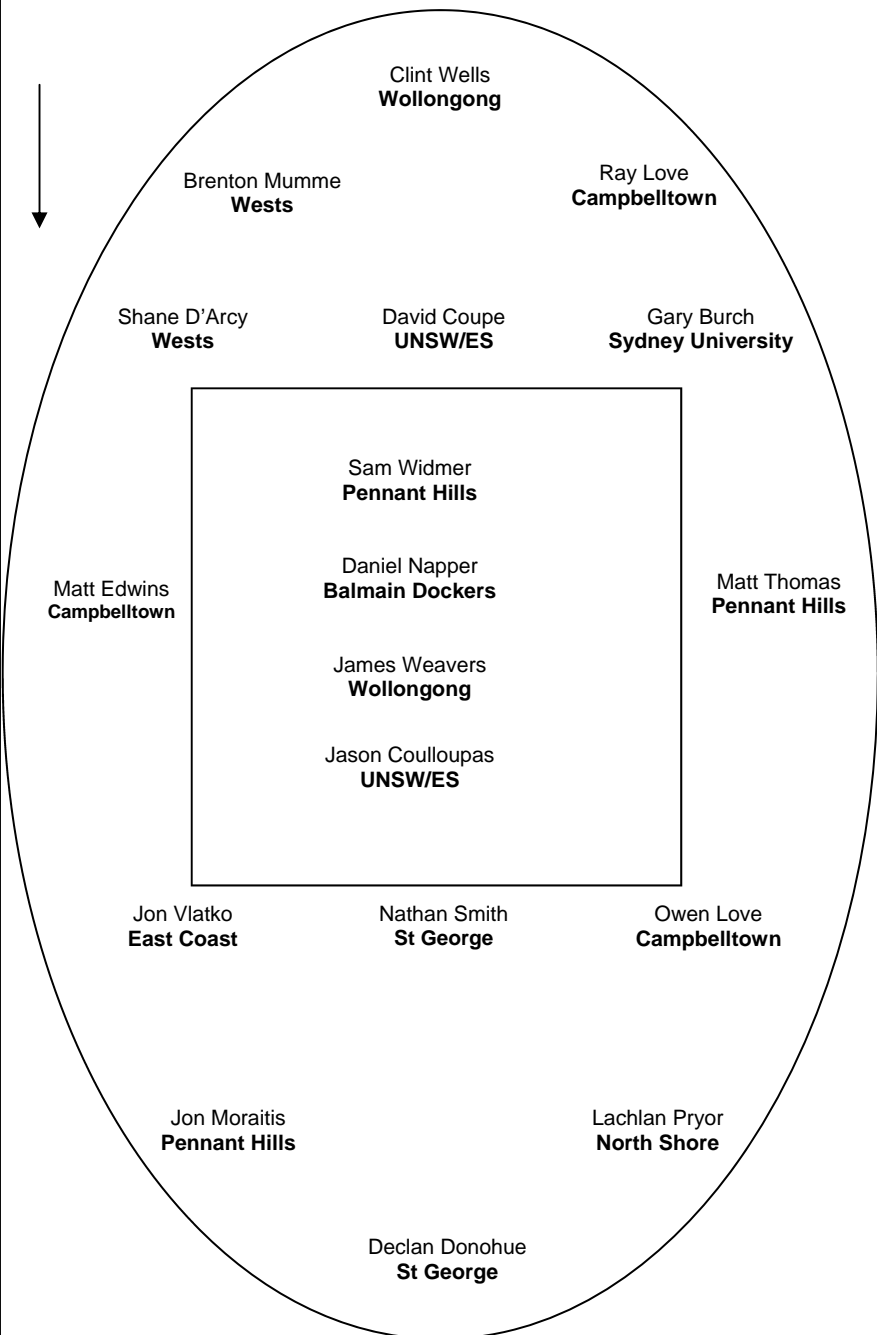

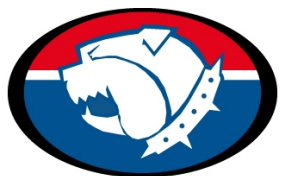

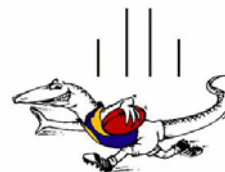
